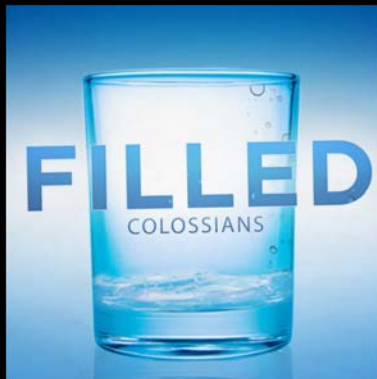

Self-harm is an act which involves deliberately inflicting pain and / or injury to one's own body... On a deep level, those who self-harm are trying to heal themselves — through punishing themselves.

Self-harm is not a modern problem but an ancient one. In 1 Kings 18:28 the prophets of Baal slashed themselves [as they tried to seek favor] from their God.

The practice of self-harming as a misguided form of...self-redemption is as old as history. It's been around since sin and shame entered the world.

Genesis 3

Adam and Eve experience shame after disobeying God.

24

Genesis 3

(8) Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the Lord God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the Lord God among the trees.

25

Shame is a powerful emotion — and it needs a powerful cloak [covering]. Adam and Eve disobey God and are ashamed when their sin is exposed. First they hide behind **shrubbery**, then behind **excuses**, then behind **anger**.

Adam blamed Eve for his sin (Genesis 3:12)

Eve blamed the serpent for her sin (Genesis 3:13)
